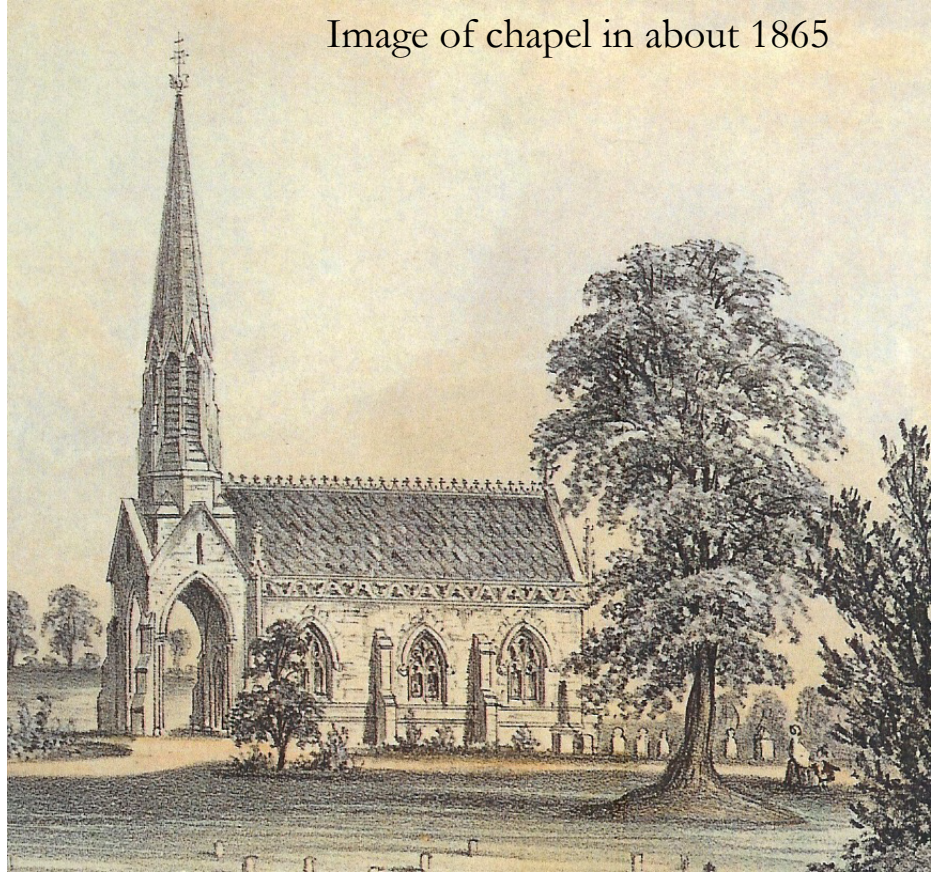

Double Depth Niche Walls

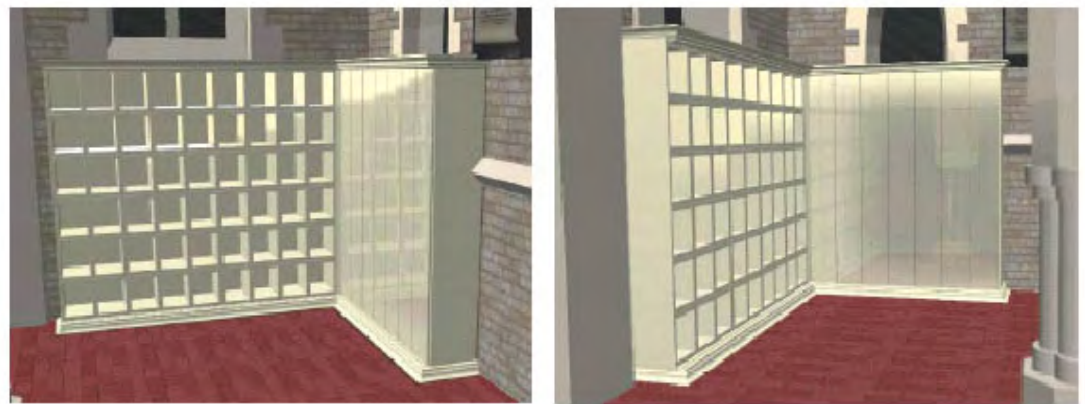
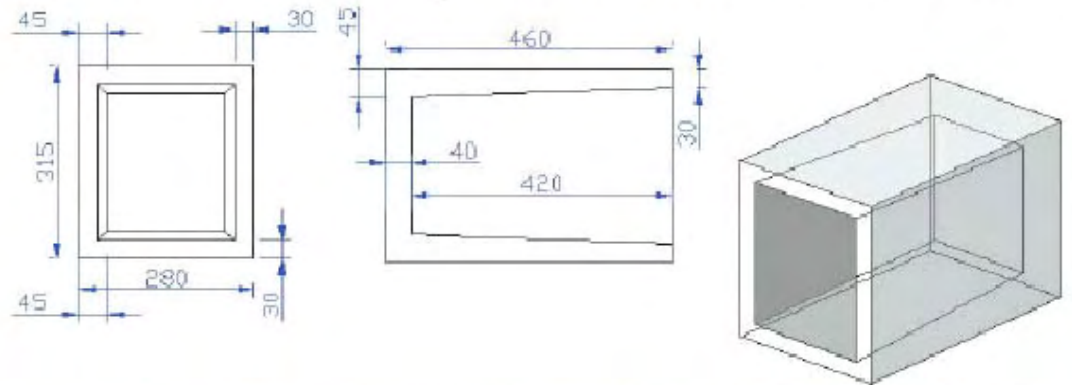
